A FIVE-year-old boy from Carrick is doing his bit for charity by making bracelets with his Dad.

Euan Shearer makes the bracelets for the new Davie Cooper Centre for children with special needs.

Euan said: "I am five years old and I am helping my dad by making charity bracelets for The Davie Cooper Centre which is for special children who will have somewhere safe to play and make new friends.

"My dad says it is a Scottish registered charity for special needs kids and their families.

"It is being built just off Great western Road at Clydebank.

"Everyone is really proud of me for helping raise money and caring for others."

Euan lives in Ballantrae and so far with his Dad has raised over £4000 online since last October for the charity.

The charity is in the name of the late Scottish Footballer Davie Cooper (a team mate and friend of Peter McCloy) and will provide a play area, sensory room, respite and outreach service for special needs kids everywhere and their families.

Dad Colin Shearer said Euan has enjoyed going to the project office and is happy telling everyone he meets about the charity and who it is for and why he is making the bracelets.
